- Is trained to listen and offer confidential support to members of our community
- Is aware of community resources

Pastoral Care volunteers participate in training sessions and continuing education. We are non-professionals who keep confidence and walk beside you through life's ups and downs.



The Pastoral Care Team Can Help

If you need a ride to church services or events.

If you have suffered loss.

If you are depressed.

If you are undergoing any sort of transition.

If you are experiencing job or financial changes.

If you are in the process of separation or divorce.

If you or a family member face a life threatening illness.

If you are homebound for any reason.

If you are lonely or hospitalized.

If you need a referral for help.

If for any reason you need a caring, supportive listener when our Minister is unavailable.

What Can Pastoral Care Offer?

We keep in touch with members confined to home, hospital or convalescent setting.

We arrange for two or three days of in-home meals.

We help with essential shopping for those unable to do these tasks until other arrangements can be made.

We arrange for rides to/from UU Marin services and events and to essential appointments, with adequate advance notice.

We refer members to community services and/or professional help as needed.

If you need temporary financial help, talk to the Minister about the possibility of a gift from the **Minister's Discretionary Fund** or the **Botermans Fund** for members who are disabled.
